Our planning process involved:

- Consultation with and advice from Victorian Primary Care Partnerships in relation to current information/intelligence regarding future PCP role/s.
- Analysis of partners’ current strategic plans
- Data analysis and review of Healthy Wellington priorities
- Roadshow visits to Level 1 Partners to share information and gain their views on priority areas
- Presentation of draft plan to WPCP Business meeting for review and feedback.

A broad WPCP Action Plan will be developed which will guide future WPCP work. This Action Plan will be a live document and will capture the breadth of work across the WPCP. From the Action Plan, individual Project Management Plans will be developed which will capture detail of each project including Governance, Resources, Budget, Background/Baseline data, Evaluation, measures and overall goals and objectives. From the Strategic Plan, the WPCP Action Plan, the individual Project Plans, staff team plans will be developed to manage and facilitate the work across our team.
